His beautiful slide presentation and what Michael taught concerning those locations made the Bible stories we've read come alive.

We started at the capital, Tel Aviv, a very secular



city. According to Michael, it is 100 years old and built on sand. In contrast, Jerusalem is 3000 years old and built on rock. Let's be certain our lives are built on a firm foundation, the Solid Rock, Christ Jesus! We saw where Cornelius, the first convert, was baptized in Caesarea. There were pictures of

major engineering projects ordered built by King Herod, and artifacts, found by archaeologists. These items amazingly and beautifully brought the Bible and archaeology together.

Michael contrasted the Sea of Galilee, which receives and gives out water, making it healthy for fish, to the Dead Sea, which only receives water, so there is no life in it at all. It's a reminder to all of us to take in God's Word, but also to freely share God's Word with others!



We cannot separate the land of Israel from the Bible and its people. Jews from all over the world have returned to their homeland, as is prophesied in the Bible. Do you realize Israel has been at war for almost 500 days? It's taken a tremendous toll on the economy in Israel, especially since tourism is a major industry there, let alone the many lives that have been lost. Did you know that "Jerusalem" means "shalom" in Hebrew, which means "City of Peace"? Let's pray for the peace of Jerusalem in obedience to God's Word.

It's my prayer that the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ will rule and reign in our hearts, even now, until He
