"GOD IS STILL WITH US."

READ

Isaiah 43:1-3, Luke 2:25-33

If you say Jesus saved your soul, your sins are forgiven and forgotten, and you have the gift of His righteousness, then you should be enjoying this holiday and every day. 500 years before Jesus was born, the prophet spoke that a virgin would conceive, bear a son, and call Him Emmanuel, God with us. Have you paused long enough to think about that? He is here now. This time of year there are those who feel that God is far away: the elderly who may feel left out or passed by; those couples wanting to have children, but still have empty arms: those who have children far from them and far from the Lord: families with unbearable heartache, grieving the loss of their loved one; fatigued caregivers; those with depleted resources; people weary with pain and sickness.
