“WAIT A MOMENT LONGER AND SEE WHAT THE LORD WILL DO.”

READ

Psalm 34:19, Isaiah 40:29-31

The easiest time to quit is when you're tired and weary, when somebody's hurt your feelings, when you think Jesus hasn't shown up in a while, and the Scriptures don't make any sense. We forget that the Bible says, "Many are the afflictions of the righteous," so we think God has abandoned us. Can you hang on for one more prayer, sing one more praise song to Jesus, listen to one more message? If you will, the Bible will come alive again, because it promises that He gives power to the faint and increases strength for the weary.
