“DON'T BE A SPECTATOR.”

READ

1 Corinthians 3:9-13; 1 Peter 2:4-10

What did God call you to do? In the Bible, God uses a garden to illustrate His call. We are to take root and bear fruit. In another passage, He uses an example of building a temple. God is the contractor and Jesus is the cornerstone. God is building this temple by using living stones — His people. As His subcontractor, you have been created to do good works. God has called you to do a specific thing. To find His will you must seek His face. You must invest yourself in the work of the Lord. Lie on your face before God and ask Him to show you what He designed you to do. Don't be a spectator. Get involved. Be busy with the work of God. What is your ministry? What is your call? Bear fruit! Only what is done for Christ will last. Everywhere you go, you should tell others about Jesus. You must be driven to say, "I've got to do something for God's glory. Tell me where I can serve."
